

Does MicroLab conduct workshops?



MicroLab conducts three types of workshops for college and university faculty. These workshops are presented by members of the MicroLab leadership team, or college or university faculty who are MicroLab users and who are located near the requesting college or university.

- Forty-five minute to one-hour workshops are presented at some professional conferences each year. Check our web site for conference announcements.
- MicroLab will present one-hour seminars followed by an optional 1-2 hour “hands-on” workshop for interested colleges and universities. There is no charge for these workshops. Call us to request a seminar.



- MicroLab works with Montana State University to sponsor 2-1/2 day summer workshops on the MSU campus in Bozeman, Montana. University housing is available for workshop participants and a registration fee is required. Workshop staff are recognized leaders in Chemical Education in the U.S.

and internationally. This workshop is advertised on the MicroLab web site, and by the Masters of Science in Science Education program at Montana State University. The 2011 workshop will be held July 18-20, 2011. Participants who attend the following 2-1/2 day curriculum development workshop may earn two graduate semester credits from the MSSE program at Montana State University.

- Faculty or TA training workshops are conducted at the request of colleges or universities who are implementing MicroLab for the first time. There is a travel and honorarium charge for the instructor, who will be a faculty member in a nearby university using MicroLab, or a member of the MicroLab leadership team.
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
